PRELIMINARY ITINERARY

SEPTEMBER 30, 2010—581 Miles, 9 1/2 Hours Driving Time

We depart from Dutch Square heading to Grantville, Pa., checking into the Hampton Inn for the night.

OCTOBER 1, 2010—245 Miles, 4 1/4 Hours Driving Time (B/D)

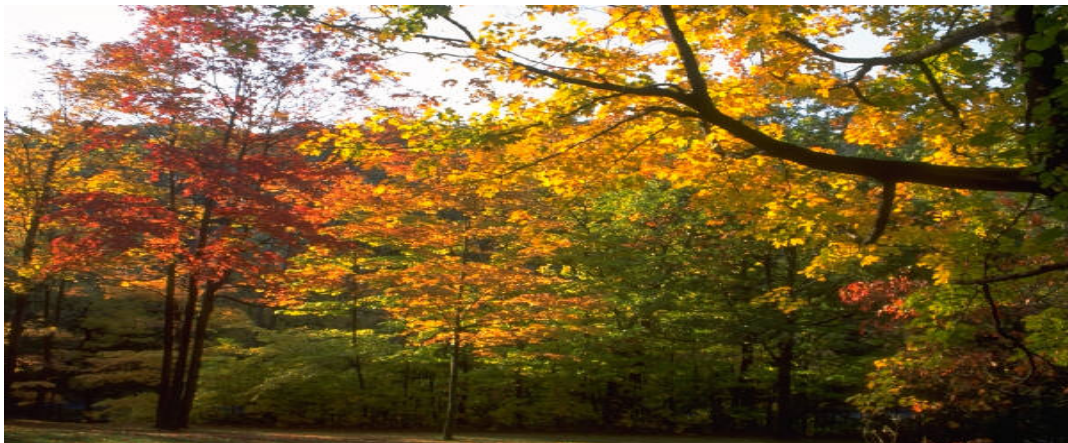
Following breakfast, we will head to Cooperstown, NY., taking a break in route.

Arriving in the Cooperstown area, we will have lunch.

Up next—THE NATIONAL BASEBALL HALL OF FAME. You will have time to explore the history of our national pastime—baseball—as well as see many artifacts of the game. With our hotel, the Lake Front, about a block from the museum, we will check in giving you the evening free to walk about the town of Cooperstown, maybe take a cruise on the Glimmerglass Queen docked right at our hotel, or just relax and enjoy dinner, included, in their dining room.

OCTOBER 2, 2010 (B)

After a leisurely fully-served breakfast, we will head to the FLY CREEK CIDER MILL. On a self-guided tour, you will be able to see the apple pressing process which produces that definite harbinger of Fall—fresh apple cider. A chance to visit the marketplace will complete our visit.



OCTOBER 2, 2010 (continued)

The famous **ERIE CANAL** calls us, so we will take a cruise up the Canal and through one of the locks. Remember the song?

- “I've got a mule, her name is Sal, 15 miles on the
 - Erie Canal She's a good old worker and a good old
 - pal, 15 miles on the Erie Canal ...”
- Arriving in Utica, NY, the night will be spent at the Radisson Hotel with the evening free to enjoy the hotel or explore the town.

OCTOBER 3, 2010 (D)

After checking out, we head to Union Station where we will board the **ADIRONDACK SCENIC RAILROAD** for a trip to Thendara/Old Forge.

Following a drive through the beautiful Adirondack mountains, we arrive at the **ADIRONDACK MUSEUM**. Exhibits explore outdoor recreation, boats and boating, transportation, the fine arts, work and industry, tourism, and community life of the mountains.

Leaving the museum behind, again we travel through the country side to Lake George where we spend the two nights at the **GEORGIAN RESORT**.

OCTOBER 4, 2010 (BD)

Today will be spent touring the area. We will enjoy a scenic two hour train ride through the beautiful mountains aboard the Upper Hudson River Railroad and visit Prospect Mountain with its 100 mile view of the lake. Additionally in store for us is a cruise on the lake and a guided tour of historic Saratoga Springs.

OCTOBER 5, 2010 (B)

Lake George is behind us as we head to Shelburne, Vt., crossing Lake Champlain on the ferry.

Located in Vermont's scenic Lake Champlain valley, **SHELBURNE FARMS** is our first stop of the day. Here we will enjoy a tour of the farm and a cheese tasting at their store.

SHELBURNE MUSEUM, one of the nation's finest, most diverse and unconventional museums of art and Americana is our next stop. Lunch (on your own) in their cafeteria and time to explore this fantastic collection in their 39 building, 25 of which are historically preserved.

OCTOBER 5, 2010 (continued)

Departure time—a short drive will bring us to Burlington, VT, where we will check into the Burlington Hilton for two nights. This hotel overlooks the lake and you will be able to walk to the waterfront and enjoy dinner while watching the sun set.

OCTOBER 6, 2010

Departure time for a tour of the LAKE CHAMPLAIN CHOCOLATE FACTORY and time to satisfy your sweet tooth in their store—can you believe, chocolate this early?

Following is a drive to Barre, Vt., approximately 45 miles, with lunch in route.

Arriving at ROCK OF AGES, you will tour the granite quarry (600 feet deep), watch artisans at work, and even sandblast your own souvenir.

Depart for return to Burlington with arrival at the Hilton in the late afternoon. The remainder of the day is free for you to explore the Burlington waterfront or just relax in the hotel.

OCTOBER 7, 2010 (D) **YOU WILL NOT GET LARGE BAG TONIGHT**

Depart for Killington Vt.—95 Miles—2 Hours

K-1 GONDLOLA—relax with a mile and a quarter ride to the top of Killington Peak (4,241 feet) and enjoy the beautiful autumn colors and scenic view of 5 states and Canada.

Depart the Peak and head to Pittsfield, Vermont, home of the NEW ENGLAND MAPLE MUSEUM with lunch in route..

Tour of the museum and tasting because a trip to Vermont is NOT a trip to Vermont without being able to taste and purchase VERMONT MAPLE SYRUP.

Drive through the beautiful Vermont countryside to Bennington.

In Bennington, we will check in to the Hampton Inn & Suites. Depart Hampton Inn for a FUN evening at the ADAMS FAMILY FARM where you will enjoy a wagon ride, a sumptuous Harvest Farm Feast, and show. We will return to the Hampton Inn at the conclusion of the show.

OCTOBER 8, 2010 (B)

Leaving Vermont behind, we head to the Berkshires of Massachusetts. We will drive the famous Mohawk Trail through some quaint New England towns with a possible view of the Bridge of Flowers in Shelburne Falls. Then continuing to Deerfield, MA.

Arriving in the Deerfield area, a visit to YANKEE CANDLE cannot be missed. You will have time for a self-guided tour, shopping, candle-making, and lunch (on your own).

A 1 1/2 hour drive will have brought us to Stockbridge, MA., where a visit to the NORMAN ROCKWELL MUSEUM is in store. This visit will encompass a tour of Rockwell's studio, Linwood Mansion, and Peter's (Rockwell's son) sculpture path. You will have time to visit the galleries and shop also.

Departing Stockbridge we will head to Pittsfield, MA., where we will overnight at the Crowne Plaza Hotel. Your evening is free to enjoy this lovely hotel.

OCTOBER 9, 2010 NO LARGE LUGGAGE TONIGHT

It is now time to head SOUTH. Today we will travel to Hagerstown, MD., stopping in Hershey, PA., for a visit at the Hershey Chocolate Factory with lunch and breaks in route. Here, we will be able to see the difference between a small gourmet operation (Lake Champlain Chocolate Factory) and mass production.

Check in to the Hampton Inn for our last night.

OCTOBER 10, 2010 (B)

HOMEWARD BOUND—we continue South with appropriate breaks and lunch in route.

Arrive at Dutch Square for the Midlands folk.

Depart from Dutch Square, the Low Country folk should arrive in Summerville at approximately 9:00 P.M.

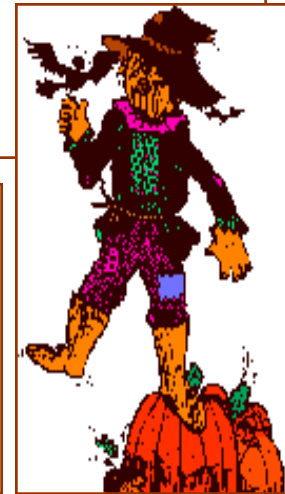
