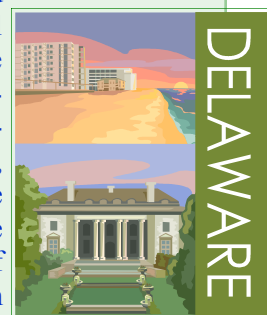
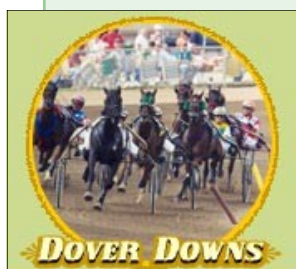
PRELIMINARY PLANS

Day 1: We'll begin our tour taking a step back in time...spending our first night at the Woodlands Hotel, a Colonial Williamsburg property, located next to the Colonial Williamsburg Visitor's Center in Williamsburg, VA. You will have the remainder of the day to enjoy Colonial Williamsburg with your Colonial Williamsburg Value Pass. This pass will give you the freedom, flexibility and convenience to enjoy the Colonial Williamsburg experience for their entire length of stay. It will provide access to all daytime programs, museums, exhibition sites and the Revolutionary City, plus complimentary shuttle transportation. (No meals included.)



Day 2: After breakfast, you will have the morning to continue to explore Colonial Williamsburg, using your Value Pass, before we continue on to Dover, Delaware. After driving north this afternoon through Washington, DC and into Delaware, we will arrive in Dover in the late afternoon and check into our 4 Star/4 Diamond resort, the Dover Downs Hotel. Your evening will be free to enjoy the casino or go shopping (tax free!!) at the nearby mall. The hotel will provide a shuttle to the mall and dinner will be on your own this evening. (Breakfast included.)

Day 3 and 4: Just 96 miles long and nestled along the Mid Atlantic seaboard, Delaware is only a two hour drive from one end to the other. We will spend the next 2 days exploring this little state with a local guide, of course, who will make us feel right at home! The Victrola Museum

The Johnson Victrola Museum is a tribute to Delaware's native son, Eldridge Reeves Johnson, who founded the Victor Talking Machine Company in 1901. Exhibits include phonographs, recordings, memorabilia, trademarks, objects, and paintings that highlight Mr. Johnson's successful business enterprises and chronicle the development of the sound-recording industry.



Air Mobility Command Center

Where do old airplanes go? The *lucky* ones go to the Air Mobility Command Museum—the only museum dedicated to *airlift and air refueling history!* During WWII, the 4146 Base Unit was involved in secret rocket development at what was then known as Dover Army Airfield. The building complex where these military secret operations took place was Hangar 1301. From the 1950s to the 1970s, various fighter squadrons called the hangar home. In the 1990s after restoration and placement on the National Register of Historic Places, Hangar 1301 was given new life as the home of the Air Mobility Command Museum.



Nascar's Monster Mile Tour

During the tour of the Monster Mile Track, one of the highlights you will see will be the 46-foot Monster Monument at Victory Plaza, presented by American Automobile Association – a larger-than-life sculpture of Dover's signature icon, Miles the Monster. The Monster Monument at Victory Plaza, presented by AAA, is one of the largest fiberglass structures in the country. Over 200 granite plaques circle the base of the structure and are dedicated to legendary drivers who have made their mark on the Dover International Speedway record books.



Barratt's Chapel

Barratt's Chapel Museum, the oldest surviving Methodist church in the United States, is located between Milford and Dover at Frederica, Delaware, is known as the "Cradle of Methodism in America." The chapel was built in 1780, on land donated by Philip Barratt, a prominent political figure in Kent County, Delaware. Barratt, who had recently become a Methodist, wanted to build a center for the growing Methodist movement in Delaware.



New Castle

We'll visit Old New Castle, the first capitol of the First State, and step back in time as we experience the charm and beauty of colonial New Castle. Walk the cobblestone streets and enjoy the historic sites of this riverfront community. New Castle, originally named Fort Casimir, was founded in 1651 by Peter Stuyvesant, who was sent to provide the Dutch with command of all river traffic. Because of its strategic locations, ownership of the settlement was constantly changing. The flags of the Netherlands, Sweden and Great Britain have all flown over New Castle.
